#### Kindergarten Registration for September 2025 -

Pre-Kindergarten registration is the week of October 15<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup>. If you have a child or know of a child that will be starting Kindergarten in September 2025, please contact Sandra to get information of getting them registered.

Registering gives us the much-needed time to organize and plan for the children. Our staffing for September is based on the student population that we have by the end of May. So, registering ensures that we have the proper number of teachers in place for September 2025.

We will be having a Welcome to Kindergarten Day on an afternoon in May. On this day the children will come to school and see their classroom, go for a little tour, do a couple of activities, while parents meet with administration to find out important details for their child starting school. Parents and children will then go for a short bus ride.

<u>Grad Class Fundraiser</u> – The grad class of 2025 will be having a bottle drive fundraiser on October 19<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 am – 12:00pm. You can drop bottles off at the school.

If you are unable to drop the bottles off, please call Sandra and give her your name and address and someone will pick the bottles up on the 19<sup>th</sup>.

Water Bottles & Utensils – This is an important reminder that we do not provide the students with dixie cups or utensils. Students MUST remember to bring their own water bottle and utensils with them to school every day.

Also, please remember that we **do NOT** have water fountains, we have water bottle fill stations, so students NEED to bring a water bottle with them if they need to have additional drinks during the school day.

Student Fees – reminder that Student Fees were due on the first day of school. If you need to make arrangements to set up a payment plan, please contact the office.

Online payments for student fees are the preferred method of payment. This way, your child does not have to bring money to school and the homeroom teachers do not have to handle and track the cash received. Elementary student fees are \$50.

Middle Level and High School student fees

are \$40.

#### What are student fees used for -

- K-5 School Supplies
- K-12 Supplemental Supplies
- Additional resources such as apps & online
- Science Fairs, Heritage Fairs, Drama festivals
- Winter carnival, clubs
- Take home projects

If student fees are not paid, the money for the school supplies, co-curricular, extra-curricular activities must come from the school's regular budget. This then takes away from money available for general classroom supplies, office supplies, school furniture, specialized Resource and Guidance supplies like wiggle chairs. Art supplies, science supplies, Library books, locks for lockers, special prizes and medals, classroom technology, classroom toys, playground equipment and general upkeep of the school.

Please contact school if you need to make special arrangements to pay your child's student fees. Not paying student fees directly impacts the children as we are not able to offer everything that we usually do because we do not have the funds.

Nut Free School - We are a NUT FREE SCHOOL. We have students who have severe allergies to pistachio, cashew, peanut, and tree nuts. Please ensure that you do not send anything to school that contains nuts. Exposure to even tiny amounts of these allergens can cause an allergic reaction and even put these students into anaphylactic shock which can be potentially life threatening. Our goal is to make our school a safe place for all our students.

#### Buses

Please note that late/not running buses are announced on the radio, posted on our school website, our Facebook page (if possible) and posted on Anglophone West website. Buses are announced by **NUMBER** not Bus Driver Name. You **MUST** know the bus number of the bus your child travels on. Bus numbers are assigned to each bus route. Sometimes our bus drivers have a spare bus, so you must know the specific number that is assigned to every route. Our drivers are.
